WORLD WATER SUMMIT 6 - ONE OF THE REAL HIGHLIGHTS OF CONVENTION WEEK IN SYDNEY

5000 Children Die Daily Due to Water and Sanitation Issues: The World Water Summit Draws **Experts from Every Region Worldwide**

Toronto, Ontario - April 29, 2014 - Disease from water and sanitation issues kill more people than all other forms of violence, including war. To date, Rotary Clubs have donated more than US\$20 million to address water issues and the Water & Sanitation Rotarian Action Group is hosting its sixth annual World Water Summit on May 30, 2014 in Sydney, Australia. Amongst other notable keynote speakers is Ms. Jenny Da Rin, Assistant Secretary, Health and Environmental Safeguards Branch, Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade, Canberra, Australia.

BRUCE AYLWARD

Assistant Director-General - Polio, **Emergencies and Country Collaboration, WHO** Dr. Bruce Aylward is the Assistant Director-General for Polio, Emergencies and Country Collaboration which brings together WHO's work in polio eradication, humanitarian response and country cooperation. Dr. Aylward, a Canadian physician and epidemiologist, joined WHO in 1992. Since 1998, he has been responsible for the oversight and coordination of all polio eradication activities across WHO's Regional Offices and the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) partnership, of which Rotary is a spearheading partner. Since the GPEI was launched in 1988, the incidence of polio has plummeted by more than 99 percent, from more than 350,000 cases a year to 223 reported cases in 2012 and the number of polio-endemic countries has been reduced to three.

KELSI COX

Program Coordinator, Digital Learning Rooms Kelsi Cox's relationship with Rotary began with pancake breakfasts in rural Canada and has led her to working with refugee youth in Aotearoa, New Zealand and helping develop Digital Learning Rooms in Fiji. She was a Rotary Youth Exchange student to Izmir, Turkey in 2002 and is now a Rotary Ambassadorial Scholar at the University of Auckland. She is driven by a desire to address global inequalities through sustainable community-based work. Cox has worked extensively in the area of adolescent health research to help improve the lives of marginalized youth in Vancouver, Canada through McCreary Centre Society. She is the Program Coordinator for Digital Learning Room, a project powered by Rotary that seeks to address inequalities through community-based access to technology. She believes in thinking outside of the box and seeing the world as a global community in which we are all connected.

MARTIN SILINK

Past President of Rotary Club of Lane Cove A Rotarian for the last 28 years, Dr. Martin Silink is a Professor of Pediatric Endocrinology at the University of Sydney and a Senior Staff Physician at the Children's Hospital, Westmead, in Sydney. He was the President of the International Diabetes Federation (IDF) from 2006-2009, a federation of national diabetes associations from 175 countries representing over 380 million people with diabetes worldwide. Dr. Silink was the architect and leader of the successful global campaign for a United Nations Resolution on Diabetes, which was adopted unanimously at the United Nations General Assembly on December 21, 2006; it was the first time the world formally recognized that the epidemic of diabetes posed "risks to families, member states and the entire



world." In 2000, he established the IDF Life for a Child Program, which provides life-saving insulin and other supplies worth over \$4 million annually to over 13,000 children with Type 1 diabetes in 45 developing countries.

ADE ADEPITAN

Polio survivor, wheelchair basketball player, journalist

Having survived polio as a youngster, Ade Adepitan has gone on to compete internationally as a wheelchair basketball player and became a TV broadcaster, now with 15 years of experience. Adepitan was the main anchor alongside Clare Balding during the BAFTA Award winning coverage of the 2012 Paralympic Games and recently fronted the Sochi Winter Games coverage. Other credits include reporting for The One Show for BBC1 and participating in the ground breaking series Beyond Boundaries for BBC2, which saw eleven individuals all with a physical disability trek across Nicaragua. Aside from his TV work, Adepitan is a motivational speaker, active charity supporter and campaigner. He received an MBE (Most Excellent Order of the British Empire) in 2005 for his services to disabled sport.

RENEE SAUNDERS

Public health advisor

Renee Saunders has more than 25 years of both national and international public health experience. She began her career with the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and has since served as a public health advisor in the following CDC offices: Division of HIV/AIDS Prevention, Prevention Program Branch and the Office of the Director; International Health Program Office, and Division of Cancer Prevention and Control, National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program. From 2000 to 2006, Ms. Saunders served as the HIV prevention technical advisor at CDC-South Africa where she co-chaired the interagency Prevention Technical Working Group and directed a comprehensive HIV training and technical assistance project for the South African labor movement. Ms. Saunders represented the US government in the development of the "International Labor Organization Code of Practice on HIV/AIDS and the World of Work", the first international labor standard for the protection of human rights at work for persons living with and affected by HIV and AIDS. Currently, she serves as a senior public health advisor in the Center for Global Health, Division of Global HIV/AIDS and has the lead responsibility for the development of public-private partnerships in support of CDC activities in collaboration with PEPFAR countries. She is also the co-chair of the interagency Public-Private Partnerships Technical Working Group and is a member of the Local Capacity Initiative working group.

BRETT LEE

Australian cricket star

Brett Lee is known throughout the cricketing world as one of the most dynamic fast bowlers of recent cricket history. Lee's career highlights include the Bradman Young Cricketer of the Year 2000, Wisden Cricketer of the Year 2006, Australian Test Player of the Year 2008 and the prestigious Allan Border Medal 2008 for the Australian Cricketer of the Year. He is an ambassador for the Cricket Education Program which focuses on high quality coaching sessions developed by Cricket Australia and the Cricket India Academy for children nine to 14 years old and plays an active role when he can. In May 2011, Lee launched Mewsic, opening the first of many planned music centers in Govandi, Mumbai, ensuring that disadvantaged children in India have the opportunity to experience the joy and power of music.

JACK SIM

Global philanthropist

Widely known as "Mr. Toilet," Jack Sim broke the global taboo of toilet and sanitation by bringing the agenda to global media centre stage with his unique mix of humor and serious facts. Born in poverty in 1957, Sim started his own business at age 24, founding 16 businesses ranging from building materials trading, manufacturing, franchising, real estate developments and the Australian International School in Singapore. After attaining independence at age of 40 as a businessman, he decided to devote the rest of his life to social work. His ventures include founding the Restroom Association of Singapore, the World Toilet Organization along with an annual summit series, and the World Toilet College. He was awarded the Singapore Green Plan Award in 2004, Social Entrepreneur of the Year in 2006 by Schwab Foundation of Switzerland, Hero of the Environment by TIME magazine in 2008, and Asian of the Year by Channel News Asia in 2009 and by Reader's Digest magazine in 2011. His film Meet Mr. Toilet premiered at Sundance Film Festival in 2012.

MAYA AJMERA

Founder, the Global Fund for Children

While traveling to India on a Rotary Ambassadorial Scholarship, Maya Ajmera witnessed a life-changing event on a train platform in Bhubaneswar. Amid the chaos of the station, a group of children sat in a circle while a teacher led them in simple learning exercises. She later learned that the children lived, played and begged on the train platforms. This small school operated on only US\$400 per year, serving 40 students who would otherwise have no opportunity to learn. Inspired by this powerful model, Ajmera went on to found The Global Fund for Children (GFC) in 1993 based on the belief that small amounts of money, when given to innovative, community-based organizations, could make a lasting impact on the lives of the world's most vulnerable children. Under Ajmera's 18 years of leadership, GFC has grown into one of the largest networks of grassroots organizations working on behalf of vulnerable children, touching the lives of over nine million children to date. Ajmera is a visiting scholar and professorial lecturer at The Paul H. Nitze School of Advanced International Studies at The Johns Hopkins University and the inaugural social entrepreneur in residence and visiting professor of the practice of public policy at Duke University. She is also an award-winning children's book author of more than 15 titles.

TOMMY SPAULDING

President, Spaulding Companies Corporation Tommy Spaulding is a best-selling author and president of the Spaulding Companies Corporation, a national leadership development, speaking, training, consulting and executive coaching organization. A worldrenowned speaker on leadership, Spaulding has spoken to hundreds of organizations, associations, schools, and corporations around the globe. His latest book, It's Not Just Who You Know (Transform Your Life and Your Organization by Turning Colleagues and Contacts into Lasting, Genuine Relationships), is a New York Times, Wall Street Journal and USA Today national bestseller. He is also the founder & president of the Spaulding Leadership Institute, a non-profit leadership development organization which runs the National Leadership Academy and Kid's Challenge. In 2000, Tommy Spaulding founded Leader's Challenge, which grew to become the largest high school civic and leadership program in the state of Colorado.

FREE RAIL SERVICE DURING THE CONVENTION

The NSW State Government together with Rotary International are pleased to announce that delegates attending the Rotary International Convention Sydney 2014 will be entitled to FREE travel on Sydney's public transport network including buses, rail, light rail and ferries, from Thursday 29 May 2014 through to Thursday 5 June 2014 (inclusive). As part of this provision a free special rail service will be provided for the exclusive use of delegates from the 30 May 2014 to 4 June 2014.

This special rail service will operate directly

between Central Station in the Sydney CBD and Olympic Park Station, which is only a short walking distance to all the key convention venues at Sydney Olympic Park. The rail service will operate from Platforms 1 – 5 at Central Station. Rotary-branded directional signage and HOC volunteers will be located at key railway stations to assist delegates in finding the rail facilities provided for their exclusive use. With a travel time of approximately 20 minutes, the rail service will be significantly faster than the equivalent journey time by shuttle bus or motor vehicle.

The rail service will typically operate with a high frequency of four trains an hour in each direction, ensuring minimal wait times for delegates accessing or leaving the convention. It is noted however that the rail service operating Friday 30 May 2014 will be a limited service with frequencies in the order of two trains per hour.

Details of the operation of the special rail service are provided below.

A free shuttle bus route 555 runs clockwise and counter clockwise from Central Railway Station to Circular Quay along George and Elizabeth streets.

CLIMB FOR A CAUSE – END POLIO NOW







AUSTRALIAN "HISTORY IN ACTION"!

Sydney Heritage Fleet is a community based, volunteer organisation which restores heritage ships that are linked to Australia's rich maritime past.

Sydney Heritage Fleet, with its roots dating back to 1965, began when a small group of volunteers began restoring a NSW State Government VIP launch the Lady Hopetoun, which was built in 1902. The Fleet now has 1,400 members and 450 active volunteers from all walks of life and Lady Hopetoun continues to sail around Sydney Harbour - 112 years after she was built!

Currently, Sydney Heritage Fleet has a 10-strong historical fleet, five of which are over 100 years old. One of its iconic ships, James Craig, is a stunning square rigger, which has 21 sails, representing 1,100 sq m. Built in 1874 in Sunderland in the UK, the square rigger was beached in Tasmania in 1932 and lay abandoned for the next 40 years.

Volunteers worked tirelessly on this beautiful vessel for 28 years, which eventually included restoring 19.5 km of rigging and installing 50,000 rivets! Now fully operational again, James Craig is the only 19th century tall ship in the world that regularly takes passengers on an ocean sailing adventure. Other vessels in the fleet include one the oldest coal burning steam tugs, Waratah.

The Fleet's current restoration project is the coastal steamer, John Oxley, which was built in 1927 in Scotland. In December 2012, the hull's last steel plate was replaced after the group worked on the vessel for 10 years and in April 2013 the ship's rudder was ceremoniously refitted.

Ross Muir, General Manager of the Sydney Heritage Fleet, says: "Not only does the organisation revive tangible evidence of Australia's maritime past, it is a wonderful social meeting place for all of our volunteers and has preserved long-forgotten skills such as steam engineering and riveting".

THE FLEETS VESSELS

James Craig 1874: This magnificently restored Tall Ship carries up to 80 passengers to sea under sail, Saturday or Sunday fortnightly, with lunch, morning and afternoon tea included. Join in with the crew or just sit back and relax. An absolute Must-Do is the NYE Spectacular fireworks. Purchase tickets online or over the phone. The ship is also available for harbour charters, corporate functions, weddings, parties, and dockside events.

Lady Hopetoun 1902: Is a classic Edwardian steam launch. For many years she served as the VIP launch for the NSW State Government. She can accommodate up to 27 passengers for harbour charters and private functions. She is very popular for hosting weddings.

Waratah 1902: Is the oldest operational coal fired steam tug in working order in Australia. She carries up to 49 passengers, and is available to hire for harbour charters, and private functions or you can experience one of our monthly Sydney Harbour Secrets tours. Check our next tour dates on our What's On, to book your place.

Boomerang 1903: Originally named Bona, is an elegant Edwardian schooner, built of hardwood frames and kauri decks and comfortably accommodates 30 passengers. This vessel is available exclusively for SHF members, and their guests, for harbour charters and functions. Why not become a member or corporate sponsor today!

Harman ex-RAN motor launch, built in 1943. She



takes 30 passengers for tours or charters. The enclosed cabin protects passengers from the elements whilst taking in the sights behind large viewing windows, ideal for school trips and families. She is very popular with training and our monthly Fleet Discovery Day — where potential volunteers meet the fleet and learn more about Sydney Heritage Fleet.

Berrima1955:An ex-BotanyBayworkboat/passengerlaunchaccommodates18passengers. She is ideal for ferrying small parties.

Protex 1908: Originally used to transport goods and personnel to ships and waterfront establishments, and was later used to ferry employees to the Palmolive soap factory. She was often referred to on the harbour, as the soap boat.

Any Rotarian, from any District in any country supporting a project in a developing country is eligible to apply. The project needs to be addressing humanitarian needs in any of the 6 Rotary areas of focus.

To apply you need to be able to supply a website address or facebook page that explains the project.

Selection of the successful recipients will be by independent judges viewing the website or facebook page.

Our judges will be looking for projects that are;

- 1. Promoting Rotary
- 2. Engaging local Rotary Clubs
- 3. Delivering project objectives in any of the 6 Rotary areas of focus.

Guidelines:

- The project is to be in a developing country as defined by the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs & Trade see: (aid.dfat.gov.au/countries/Pages/ default.aspx)
- Successful grants will be paid via RAWCS. Local fees and currency exchange costs will be the responsibility of the recipient.
- Judges will attempt to select recipients from different geographic zones.
- The grants are to support existing or established projects.
