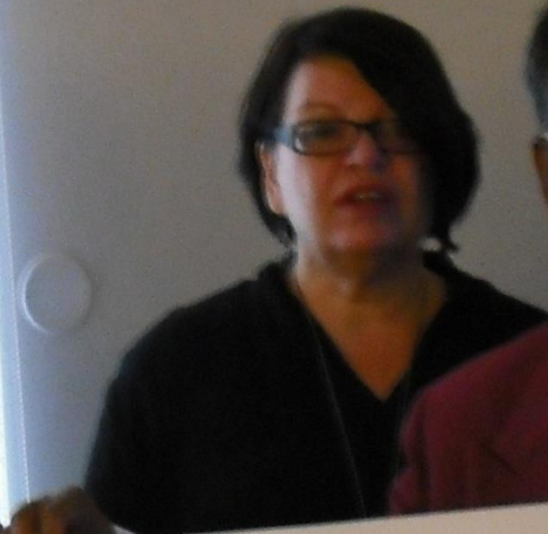

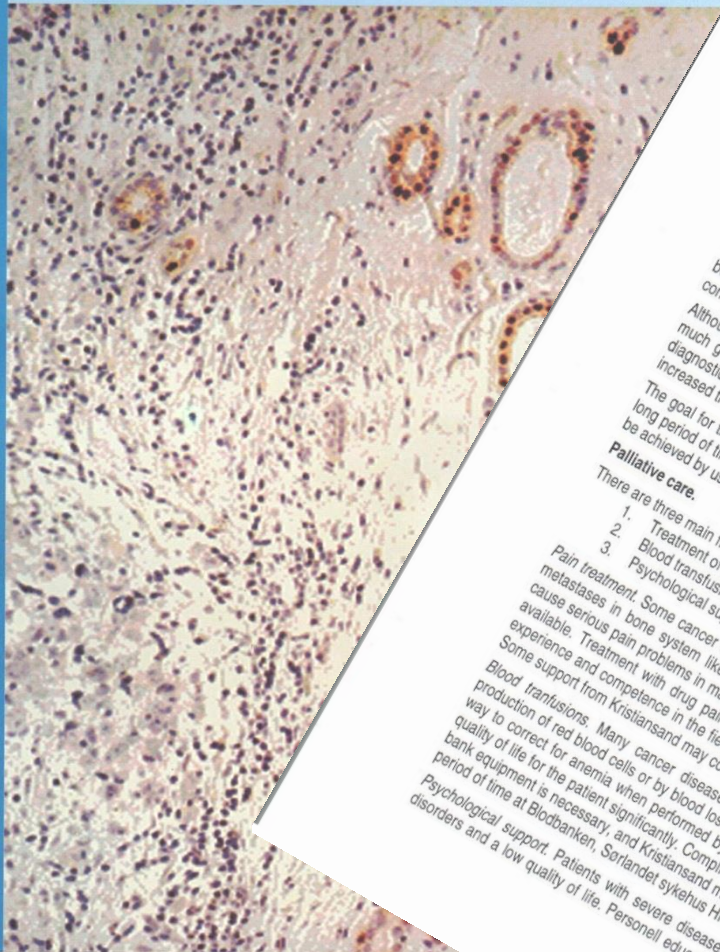

The Future of Rajshahi Cancer Hospital and Research Center (RCHRC)

This short article is only some thoughts and ideas about the future of Rajshahi Cancer Hospital and Research Center. They are the result of discussions with representatives of RCHRC during a short visit to Rajshahi and RCHRC March 2010 and information from Annual Reports from RCHRC 2007 - 2010. The motivation is in part based on discussions about further support from Kristiansand in Norway. As far as I know exact number of cancer patients in Bangladesh are not known, but it may be more than 1 million cancer patients in Bangladesh. Every year another additional 200 000 people are diagnosed with cancer and about 150 000 die from different kinds of cancer every year (Bulletin vol 01, 2009). Thus the needs for cancer diagnostics, treatment and palliative care in Bangladesh and also in Rajshahi region are obviously very high, and therefore further development of RCHRC is of great importance. Representatives of RCHRC know best how to organize this development, but some thoughts and ideas from outside may be of value.

The process of planning.

There are some tough and important choices to take in this further development of RCHRC, and these are first of all priorities between the main fields of clinical oncology with palliative care, diagnostics and various treatment strategies. This is further complicated by the priorities between epidemiology, early diagnostics of cancer and treatment strategies.

Although painful these choices have to be based on the evaluation of the resources that are available, and I am convinced that much good work in clinical oncology may be performed without the use of the most expensive and complicated methods in diagnostics and treatment of cancer. In the Western world the costs for diagnostics and treatments of cancer have enormously increased the last few years although the effects have not been always very impressive!

The goal for the quality of clinical oncology should always be high and ambitious, but it is necessary to take step by step for a long period of time. Of course these problems are very difficult, but I am convinced that much good work in clinical oncology may be achieved by using rather simple and not so expensive methods, but it depends on choice of strategy.

Palliative care.

There are three main fields of activity in palliative care:

1. Treatment of pain caused by cancer diseases.
2. Blood transfusions for correction of anemias caused by cancer diseases.
3. Psychological support to patients suffering from serious diseases.

Pain treatment. Some cancer diseases but not all cause serious pain problems. Cancer diseases that progress to advanced stages cause serious pain problems in many patients. Radiation therapy may be very helpful in these patients, but must be administered by health professionals with experience and competence in the field. Some of these drugs are expensive, and RCHRC has to develop a way to get the drugs. Some support from Kristiansand may contribute financially to the fund.

Blood transfusions. Many cancer diseases cause severe anemias in different ways by negative effects on the marrow production of red blood cells or by blood losses due to bleeding from tumors or by bleeding tendency. Blood transfusion is a safe way to correct for anemia when performed by use of modern methods and equipment. Correction of anemia may improve the quality of life for the patient significantly. Complications of blood transfusions are seldom when performed in a proper way. Blood bank equipment is necessary, and Kristiansand may contribute in financing this. Personnel at RCHRC may come for training for a period of time at Blodbanken, Sorlandet sykehus HF Kristiansand.

Psychological support. Patients with severe diseases often have psychological problems with anxiety, depression, sleeping disorders and a low quality of life. Personnel educated in a proper way may significantly give valuable help to patients with the

Vi fikk også i stand et samarbeid med Fiskå ungdomsskole i Kristiansand som ønsket å gjøre en innsats for kreftsykehuset gjennom "Gi en dag"-opplegget

med Rotaryklubber i Australia, USA og Japan. Mye av utstyret på klinikken er innkjøpt takket være Maching Grant Prosjektet. Det var utrolig godt å se at alt utstyret var på plass!

I Rajshahi distrikt bor det 44 millioner mennesker – og dette er det nærmeste kreftsykehuset. En del velstående mennesker drar til India for behandling – men for den vanlige befolkningen og for de fattige var det tidligere ikke noe tilbud for kreftbehandling. Nå behandles barn med en type blodkreft, mødre med brystkreft og ellers voksne med ulike typer kreft. Det er behov for mer utstyr, midler til innkjøp av dyre medisiner og en lindrende kreft-søkende virksomhet i slummen.

Vennskapsby

Rajshahi er vennskapsby til Kristiansand. Byen har ca. 800.000 innbyggere og ligger nord vest i Bangladesh. Hvert tredje år har skoler og barnehager i Kristiansand innsamlinger for å støtte ulike prosjekt i Rajshahi, slik som Fiskå ungdomsskole. Distriktsguvernør Ghulam Mustafa hadde fått melding om at det skulle komme rotarianere fra Norge. Vi ble invitert til å

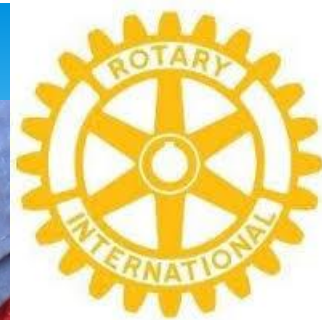
delta på «Visionary District Conference 2014, RID 3281, Bangladesh». Vi fikk en hjertelig velkomst og vi ble presentert som æresgjester sammen med noen andre utenlandske deltakere.

"Change Lives"

Konferansen ble en stor opplevelse. Det var 1600 deltakere til stede og programmet hadde et sterkt fokus på media, kvinner i lederposisjoner, humanitær innsats i lokalmiljøet og betydningen av TRF «in making a difference in the world». I en multimediepresentasjon fikk vi et innblikk i mange flott eprosjekter som Rotary driver eller har gitt støtte til i Bangladesh. Bangladesh er svært opptatt av sin kultur. Dette kom tydelig fram i de kulturelle innslagene som var etter hver pause. Tekstene i sangen og dansen handlet mye om frigjøringen som fant sted i 1972.

Etter noen opplevelsesrike dager i Bangladesh fikk vi virkelig oppleve betydningen av mottoet for dette Rotaryåret: «Engage Rotary Change Lives»
